- 2. District resident students that qualify for the Free and Reduced Lunch (FRL) program with a sibling admitted at the school
- 3. District resident students with a sibling admitted at the school
- 4. Children of full-time employees at the school
- District resident students that qualify for the Free and Reduced Lunch (FRL) program and are currently attending the school's 4-year-old ECE program
- 6. District resident students who are currently-attending the school
- All other District resident students that qualify for the Free and Reduced Lunch (FRL) program
- 8. District resident students who currently attend a closed school
- 9. All other District resident students



- 10. Non-District resident students who are currently attending the school's 4-year-old ECE program <u>or</u> have a sibling admitted at the school
- 11. All other non-District resident students

Applicants for grades 1-5 are prioritized in the following way:


- 1. Students who reside in the school boundary (guaranteed in Round 1 only) or District resident students who are currently attending the school

Denver Public Schools makes every attempt to accommodate siblings who apply together in the same school year. A separate SchoolChoice application must be submitted for each sibling to be considered.




2018-19 School Choice and Enrollment Snapshot Bromwell Elementary School - 214





Positive Behavior Intervention Support Program: PAWS At Bromwell Elementary, we define student behavior expectations with a positive, asset based approach. Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS) Systems at Bromwell include a Whole Child Task Force and Restorative Practices Cohort to support teachers and staff in promoting positive student behaviors and to problem solve with teachers to support students in the classroom. The PBIS Team supports teachers, students and parents to correct negative student behavior in the following ways:

- 1. Identify the expected student behaviors and desired outcomes
- 2. Teach, model and practice what those behaviors look like, sound like and feel like
- 3. Specifically praise appropriate behavior with private or public acknowledgement
- 4. Collect data to determine successes and barriers to reaching the desired goals
